



Steel: a passion that is stainless

*Inoxea, a company with so many souls,
which also includes Inoxeart*

The definition of “seriousness” is clearly visible upon entering Inoxea, indicating its modus operandi and the main inspiration for this historic company which has seen much evolution in its first 55 years.

“From the specialized metalworking of stainless steel for the petrochemical sector, we have become a hub which supplies stainless steel in various modes: prime material, semi-worked, the construction of manufactured items in accordance with the specific techniques of the client”, tells Armando Grandi, Ceo of Inoxea and the heir of the company founded by his father, Paolo, in 1962. Working alongside of him is his wife, Cecilia Spandrio, who together with the support of a close-knit team, takes the company’s basic philosophy forward, and namely “to create, using an ancient trade in a new way”, with absolute

attention paid to safety, the obtaining of the best of certification, and the pursuit of the company’s wellbeing. The latter is testified to by the company’s employees, starting from Roberto Pontara, who has been enthusiastically working at the company since he was 14. And by Mauro Linetti, awarded the Work Merit Star for company loyalty and for his moral gifts. Young Badar instead testifies to the importance given by Inoxea to alternating school and work, as at the end of his apprenticeship he was hired! Equally admirable is the desire on the part of the senior members of the team to transmit skills to junior ones – like Luca Baldo, in the mechanics area, or Antonio Alfieri, whose son for some time now has also been working here. But Inoxea has yet more surprises in store.

“Normally, waste stainless steel is 100% recycled, and each time it is re-melted, its quality improves. Inoxea keeps a part of the scraps to transform into braziers, coat racks, umbrella stands, and lamps”, declares Grandi. Inoxea’s Inoxeart division makes these pretty and useful objects with typical stainless steel characteristics like resistance to corrosion and long-lastingness. For the future, Inoxea is focusing on a new laser system for the cut-

ting of the sheets to work with its existing plasma cutting starting this June, on the adoption of barcodes for better traceability of prime material, and allowing clients to pick up any document directly online.

Inoxea continues on its route of “Good Practices” for which it was awarded by the Ccia di Brescia both in 2016 as in 2017.
